Foxworthy currently hosts the hit show *Are You Smarter Than A 5th Grader*, which airs on FOX and is in syndication. One of the most respected and successful comedians in the United States, Foxworthy is the largest selling comedy-recording artist in history, a multiple Grammy Award nominee and a best-selling author.

[Bill Engvall](#) currently hosts the game show *LINGO* for GSN. He also recently completed a 3 episode arc on the TNT show *Hawthorne*, narrated a documentary for the Speed Channel on Darrel Waltrip and starred in the Hallmark Channel movie *Kiss at Pine Lake*. Previously, he hosted *Country Fried Home Videos* - one of the highest rated shows on Country Music Television (CMT).
